

Innovative Advocacy in a Decentralized Indonesia: the AFP Indonesia Experience



Family Planning in Indonesia.

Decentralized authority under district/municipality government. "FP no longer under the direct control by central government."

Decentralization

Law No. 52 Year 2009 on Population and Family Development

Subdivisions

34 Provinces* 514 Districts/ Municipalities* 80,714 Villages*

FP Office

By 2015, only 26 districts out of the total 514 had a stand-alone FP office.*

FP Demand Generation

The number of FP Field Officers decreased from 33,000 in the 1990s to 28,000 in 2004 and 20,000 in 2007.*



Village Advocacy Strategy.

Started in 4 villages in Karanganyar by the end of 2014

Three As Model: Family Planning Village Advocacy



Access to Qualified FP Services

Ensure village midwives are certified and can provide FP services

Allocation of Funds for FP Ensure FP activities are allocated in the village budget



Formed in March – April 2015, FP village teams that consist of village leaders, village government boards, cadres, religious leaders, community leaders, midwives, PKK (family welfare organization), community health centers (Puskesmas), youth organizations, and FP Field Officers, started implementing activities in May 2015.

Advocacy Results.

The advocacy strategies now is applied in all **162** villages in Karanganyar




Supporting policies, such as **District and Village Head regulations**, **endorsement letters and decrees** issued to strengthen the implementation of FP program.



All 162 allocated from **\$80 - \$440** per village/year or a total of **\$49,937** for FP activities at village level in 2015. In 2016, the allocation increased from **\$80 - \$2,560** per village/year.

This strategy was also adopted and applied in **24** additional villages in **6** other districts through **Improving Contraceptive Method Mix (ICMM)** –a project funded by USAID and DFAT.

Number of New Users from 28 Villages Jan - Dec 2014 (Before) and Jan - Dec 2015 (After)



Impact.

Significantly increased numbers of LAPM new users in all 28 villages in 7 districts.
